## Concert recap: Jimmy Eat World at the Capitol Theatre

This weekend, Jimmy Eat World made a stop at the Capitol Theatre in Port Chester to help celebrate the 10th year anniversary of their 2004 album "Futures". This album is best known for containing the hugely popular single "Work" along with "Pain" and "Futures." At the time, it was highly anticipated after their previous album, 2001's "Bleed American", which helped get their name out to the MTV crowd via their 20-something anthem "The Middle."

To commemorate the October 19th, 2004 release, the band has been touring across America, playing the album in its entirety. Making their way through the record from beginning to end (in order), the set kicked off with the energetic "Futures" and ended with the very lovely "23." The band paused for a short break and returned for the first of two encores, which included three songs off their EP "Stay On My Side Tonight", which is a record usually left off a tour setlist. Needless to say, getting to see songs like "Disintegration" (a song which hasn't been played live in six years), "Closer" and "Over" (which have never been played; source: Setlist.fm) was a welcomed surprise. Continuing to keep the audience on their toes, the band dusted off "Claire", off of their early record "Static Prevails." The second encore ended with two of their
